#### **BREASTFEEDING IN WIC**

New Jersey WIC breastfeeding initiation rates increased by **22 percent** between 2010 and 2022.



Among WIC infants who initiated breastfeeding in New Jersey in 2022, 19 percent continued breastfeeding at 6 months.



Online Shopping: New Jersey WIC (NJ WIC) will be working with Wakefern (one of the largest WIC vendors in the state) to work out the mechanics of how delivery fees will be charged and how state funds for delivery can be separated from federal funds for food by using Wakefern as a model for authorizing other vendors. NJ WIC plans to engage EBT processors and retailers in their state to discuss and identify the technical design of the WIC online shopping solution.
