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

### **BREASTFEEDING IN WIC**

In 2022, 24 percent of 6- to 13-month-old infants and children in FSIP (NM) initiated breastfeeding.



Among WIC infants who initiated breastfeeding in Five Sandoval Pueblos in 2022, 20 percent continued breastfeeding at 6 months.
