GREAT Start



GREAT Start is a free program for families who are pregnant or have children under the age of three. Family educators meet with families in their homes to support them in their roles as parents, discuss baby and toddler development, and collaborate on their family's goals.

Supplemental doula help is also available beginning at 28 weeks of pregnancy, continuing through labor and delivery and lasting for two months postpartum. Medicaid

Medicaid Presumptive Eligibility (MPE) Program

The MPE program provides immediate, temporary coverage of health care for income-eligible pregnant women. There are no copays or premiums. Many prenatal care clinics can help you apply or call 866-255-5437.

Moms & Babies

Moms & Babies provides healthcare coverage for women with low income during pregnancy and for up to 12 months after childbirth. This coverage includes clinic visits, hospital care, labor and delivery, as well as prescription medicines. Additionally, it covers healthcare for the baby up to the age of one.

- Eligibility for Moms & Babies is not limited to citizens or legal immigrants.
- A social security number is not required to qualify for Moms & Babies.
- There are no co-pays or premiums associated with Moms & Babies.
