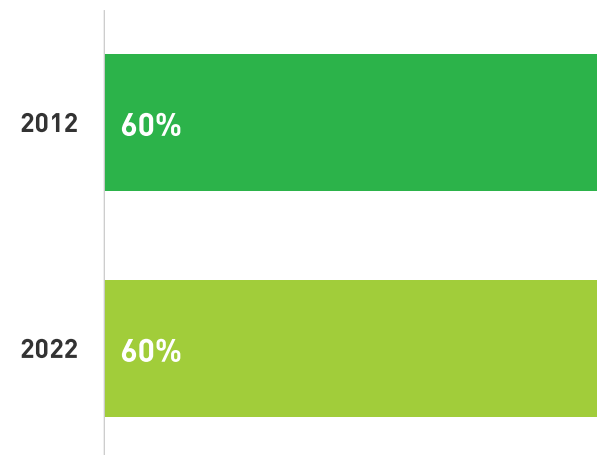

BREASTFEEDING IN WIC

Georgia WIC breastfeeding initiation rates did not change between 2012 and 2022.



Among WIC infants who initiated breastfeeding in Georgia in 2022, **19 percent** continued breastfeeding at 6 months.
